2019 Collaboration Development Fund Request for Proposals

The Office of Global Programs requests small-scale proposals in the following areas as a way to enhance Penn State's strategic partnership with National Taiwan Normal University (NTNU):

- 1) Research projects
- 2) Collaborative courses

This program is open to faculty members affiliated with National Taiwan Normal University and Penn State in all disciplines. Successful proposals will be those which will (i) demonstrate an immediate potential to be sustainable through external funding sources and (ii) will involve a clear collaborative effort between faculty members on both National Taiwan Normal University and Penn State sides.

Penn State applicants must identify a faculty or staff to work with at NTNU and vice versa prior to submitting the application. Up to 5 awards could be made depending on the number and nature of applications.

Qualifications:

Applicants must be full-time Penn State or NTNU faculty or staff members.

Proposal Evaluation:

1. A panel of faculty and administrators from Penn State and NTNU will evaluate and select the projects to be funded.
2. Funding priority will be given to projects that:
 - a. Advance collaborative research and education of high academic value.
 - b. Strengthen the connectivity and relationship between NTNU and Penn State.
 - c. Creates a team with multiple faculty and students at each university.
3. The evaluation criteria and weighting:
 - a. Research/Academic excellence
 - b. Project idea and quality
 - c. Plan to create a self-supporting, sustainable collaboration program after the seed money expires or the potential of plan for external funding
 - d. A clear collaborative effort between faculty or staff members at Penn State and NTNU; it is imperative that the applicant identifies a NTNU partner and his/her agreement to participate in the project.

Applicants should submit:

1. Complete the attached form.
2. A 2-page single-spaced proposal that details the specific aims, background of the study, preliminary data (if any), research plan, innovation/significance, and details on the role of each participant on the project, and plan for seeking external funding or other sustainable means;
3. Line item budget (up to \$5,000 for Penn State applicants and the matching funds of \$5,000 from NTNU for NTNU applicants);
4. Budget categories including consumables and travel expenses narrative explaining how line items in the budget relate to the work you are proposing [NOTE: The form provided may be used to help guide you.];
5. 2-page CVs of the project faculty (participants);
6. For Penn State applicants, letter or email from NTNU faculty/staff confirming NTNU participation.
7. Combine all documents (including the form) into one pdf.
8. Proposals should be emailed to Rose Tan at global-partners@psu.edu.
